

Voor eenige maanden bevond De Jong zich te Amsterdam, waar hij zich bezig hield met zwarthandel.
'n Onbetrouwbaar adres waar hij indertijd onderdak vond was: Herman Dootjes
Vinkenstraat 64
Amsterdam.

Bij een eventuele huiszoeking aldaar dient men rekening te houden dat de achterkant een gunstige gelegenheid biedt om te ontluchten.

In de buurt van Dootjes woont (No. 56 of 58) een kolenhandelaar (ong. 52 jaar) welke volkommen te vertrouwen is en inlichtingen kan verstrekken.

De Jong komt geregelde in een winkel, gelegen : Albert Kuipstraat 138, alwaar hij artikelen koopt en deze in de richting Aalsmeer aan de man brengt.

's Morgens (van 8-9 uur) en 's avonds (van 6-8u.) komt de Jong dikwijls in de Egelantiersstraat 30 te Amsterdam, waar heel waarschijnlijk familie van Herman Dootjes woont.

De Jong heeft een broer genaamd Lodewijk (Roepnaam: Louis), ongeveer 31 jaar, welke als portier werkzaam is bij het Tuschinski Theater te Amsterdam en woont op de Prinsengracht 29 I.l. Louis is niet volkomen betrouwbaar, doch onder bedreiging zijn Chef te waarschuwen zou hij de verblijfplaats van zijn broer aanwijzen.

In de Jekerstraat 114 te Amsterdam woont waarschijnlijk een vriend van De Jong.

De Jong werkt te Amsterdam vermoedelijk samen met de reeds boven genoemde van Diermen.

P.R.D.-WAR HISTORY:

1. In 1929, DE JONG left school in Amsterdam, where he was living at Bataviastraat 4. After having had various jobs, at a firm dealing with permanent wave machines, where he was an assistant sales-man; as a nicotine at Iushinski's theatre; as a lift-boy at Carlton's Hotel; and as a ward-robe boy at Astoria's Restaurant, suspect at last got employed at MOSMANS' Garage, where he obtained the job as a repairer for push-bikes.
2. In the autumn of 1934 he moved to Utrecht, where he lived at Prinsstraat 4 or 6. In this town it was very difficult for him to earn some money and consequently was unemployed for the first half year.
3. From 1934 till April 1st. 1935 he was a member of the N.S.B., for at the latter date he was conscripted (1st. Regiment Veld Artillerie 3rd. batterij at Utrecht). He became the rank of a "Wachmaester" (Sergeant) and got released at 1st April 1936.
4. Not being able to find a job somewhere he started to study bookkeeping and commercial arithmetic (handelsrekenen).
5. At the end of 1936 he got employed at the accountants office of J. HAVEKAMP, Leidscheweg 41ab as a clerk and remained with them till ~~approx.~~ August 28th. of 1939 (Outbreak of the XXX Mobilisation).
6. In 1937 (in the autumn), he became a member of the N.S.B. for the second time. This because he could not agree with the social circumstances which were ruling and because of his revolutionary ideas.
(According to this, we should expect him to be a very active member of the N.S.B., but as he claims, he studied very seriously and spared any time to it. That's why he had little time left to be an active member).
This period of him, being a member of the N.S.B. ended in August 1939, when he was mobilised.
7. At August 28th., when the mobilisation broke out, he had to report for duty at Utrecht, Kruiselaan. A couple of days later on, the section to which he was attached (1st. Regiment Veld Artillerie) went to SOEST and stayed there for three months. As he would be able to work during the evenings at the Accountance Office of Havekamp, he asked to be transferred to Utrecht. This happened in December 1939 and got attached to "Staf 17th. Regiment Veld Artillerie". He stayed in Utrecht for three months and moved with the section to the river MOERDIJK at DUBBELDAM. (Commanding Officer was Capt. LENGE).
Subject stayed at Dubbeldam till the outbreak of the hostilities at 10th. May 1940, when he

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was captured by the Germans and sent to DORDRECHT as a prisoner of war. Then subject went back to DUBBELDAM and was demobilised there.

8. At the end of May, when he was demobilised, subject went back to UTRECHT, at the Office of HAVEKAMP. He stayed with them till September '44, when the Office was closed (Railway Strike), because subject could not travel anymore to visit clients.
9. In June 1941, (Outbreak of the war against Russia) subject became a member of the N.S.B. for the third time because of his anti-communistic feelings.
10. At October 1st. 1944, subject was employed as a motor-driver with the Bahnhofs Kommandant, at the Malibahn Station at UTRECHT, which job he held till December 1st. 1944. As the job did not give him enough work to do, he asked to resig

SECURITY PERIOD.

11. In December 1944 subject met his brother, RUTGER DE JONG, a former "ss man", who came from Germany LANGEMARK STADIUM. This brother Rutger, spoke with subject about the SONDERKOMMANDO WELL. This was absolutely new to him; he had never heard of it before.
12. He, Rutger, told subject, that he had a contact with this Kommando via ss.Unteroffz. SLOP. This Kdo. should have a special mission and was situated at MAARSBERGEN. According to my brother, subject states, this Kdo. offered means of making money, in which way, however subjects' brother did not give a specified information. As a matter of fact subjects' brother told subject that this Kdo. fought Communism.
13. Early February 1945 subject went to MAARSBERGEN with an introduction of his brother to Lieutenant WELL. Reporting at MAARSBERGEN, Lt. WELL appeared not to be in. At MAARSBERGEN he was told by Feldwebel FRANZ, that Lt. WELL was in Germany for a short time.
14. Approx. February 15th. 1945, subject went to MAARSBERGEN for the second time to see Lt. WELL. This time WELL and subject talked things over for about one hour. WELL asked subject if he would become a V-mann. Subject states, he did not fully understand the real meaning of V-mann and thought it meant "Verbindungsmann" (Liaison-man). Subject was told by WELL, that his task would be to supply agent in UTRECHT with rations (foodstuffs). Subject had to get hold of these rations in the provinces of Groningen or Friesland, on the black-market, while these rations had to be stored in UTRECHT. For this doing to the Kdo., WELL would keep subject supplied with cigarettes and rations of the "Wehrmacht". WELL did not assist subject in carrying out the a/m task, as he would to be self supporting in the near future. (This had to be considered as a part of training.) After subject would have located the needed

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rations, WELL would assist him by supplying "Bescheinigungen" (permits), in order to avoid confiscation by some-body else.

15. As subject felt sure, that WELL would be able to acquire the needed rations via the "Wehrmacht"; he never succeeded in carrying out his task, for which he, as a matter of fact did not take the least trouble. Besides subject had a feeling that WELL did not take the matter seriously.
16. Five days after his first talk with WELL, subject returned to MAARSBERGEN to collect his rations. Again five days later on WELL told subject, that in the future he had to collect his rations only once every ten days.
17. On the 25th. February 1945, WELL told subject that weapons would be taken to UTRECHT and be hidden there. These arms would be kept there for the agents of the a/m Kdo., that would arrive after the German Capitulation.
18. APPROX. March 15 th. 1945, when subject went again to MAARSBERGEN to collect his rations, WELL told him, that on that very evening at 20.00 hours the arms would arrive at "Hotel de Hommel", and ordered him to be present. This hotel is situated just outside the city of UTRECHT.
Some time ago WELL had supplied subject with a "night permit".
19. On going to the "Hotel de Hommel", subject claims he was accompanied by DE WIT J. or C., member of the N.S.B. who knew about subjects' connections with the Kdo. WELL.
Arms and escorting military personnel arrived at that Hotel. The car was driven by REINHARD (of the Kdo. WELL) while the personnel was commanded by Unteroffz. DECKER (of the Kdo. WELL). Present were privates MACH (of the Kdo. WELL) and ... (name unknown), see appendix.
20. From the "Hotel de Hommel" the party went to "STRIJKVIERTEL", a country road, where the arms were buried.
The load consisted of:
10 (ten) rifles of French origine, wrapped up in white sheets.
2 (two) cases. One case containing rifle ammunition.
One case containing explosives.
2 (two) Drums containing "Kasten Minen".
Subject claims, that DE WIT (see par. 19), had to sketch the situation.

21. At the 25th. March 1945 subject went to MAARSBERGEN again to collect his rations, where he learned that WELL had departed to Germany with the German members of his Kdo. Only Unteroffz. SLOOT (Dutch) stayed there with 10 or 11 members (all Dutchm.) see Appendix. F
22. This SLOOT did not inform subject about his (SLOT) MISSION, WELL had given him.

As subject claims SLOT seemed not to know what to do and sent four Slodbers to UTRECHT to hide there. They were the following members of the Kdo. WELL, viz:

J. BORRA, J. HOUWEN, van VULPEN and van DIJK.

From the remaining members three of them were sent to Amsterdam viz:

VALENTIN, Klaus DEBOOYER and MEYVIS.

4. HOUWEN
5. VAN DIJK
6. DEBOOYER

- 20. At the end of March Subject contacted with the N.B.S. via RIJNTJES, see Appendix, who lived at 16 van de Hoeklaan or van de Broeklaan at UTRECHT. (Can be indicated on a map). *by subject*. This RIJNTJES was the chief bookkeeper at the printing-office of BOSCH, Oudegracht UTRECHT.
 - 21. Subject claims that REINTJES had brought him into contact with a member of the Underground Movement named JAN HOOGENDIJK (cover name), who lived at Willem Barendtsstraat 22 or at the address to forward correspondence to being 97 Monsieur van de Veteringstraat both at UTRECHT.
 - 22. A short time afterwards subject and his brother RUTGER mentioned above, had a meeting with HOOGENDIJK of the N.B.S. At this meeting HOOGENDIJK was told then all about the Kdo. WELL and its members who went into hiding at UTRECHT, AMSTERDAM, LEIDEN and probably also in ROTTERDAM. HOOGENDIJK, however, seemed not to be interested in arms, but asked subject to arrange cooperation with the a/m hidden members.
 - 23. The members HOUWEN and BORRA agreed except VAN VULPEN, while van DIJK went underground for his own accord.
 - 24. HOOGENDIJK supplied 8 ration cards for hidden members at UTRECHT and DE JONG brothers, 2 persoonsbewijzen (Identity Cards) for brother of subject (RUTGER) and VAN VULPEN. Besides he supplied subject with 100 Kilograms of potatoes for his own use.
 - 25. Subject claims that HOOGENDIJK had asked him to get more information about other Kdo's. In HAARNSBERGEN subject got to know the existence of two other Kdo's, situated at APeldoorn (Kdo. HACKENBERG) and one at GRONINGEN (Kdo. STAAL).
 - 26. In the beginning of April 1945, subject was visited by SLOT and VAN DRUNEN at Haendelstraat 14 at UTRECHT. SLOT told subject that he had been in contact with Hb+stf. PROEBSTING, Malibeen in UTRECHT. SLOT wanted the addresses of hidden members, for they had to report themselves at PROEBSTING'S. Subject and his brother Rutger were told by SLOT to report at PROEBSTING too. Subject claims not to have SLOT supplied with names and addresses of hidden members, on the contrary he claims to have warned them against SLOT.
 - 27. Before reporting at PROEBSTING, subject and his brother went to HOOGENDIJK (N.B.S.) first. The latter agreed but warned us to be carefull. PROEBSTING introduced himself as "POLITISCH REFERENT" and declared that SLOT had seen him and told everything about Kdo. WELL, its action and the hiding of arms. PROEBSTING pointed out that now he was the Commander and SLOT being Sub Comdr. PROEBSTING also wanted to use the hidden members for special missions.
 - 28. The evening following the afternoons meeting, subject and brother went to "Hotel de Hommel" where they ran into PROEBSTING and three other ss man (names not known to subject). The whole party then went to STRIJKVIERTEL to the buried dump. (see par. 20).
 - 29. The evening following the afternoons meeting, subject and brother went to "Hotel de Hommel" where they ran into PROEBSTING and three other ss man (names not known to subject). The whole party then went to STRIJKVIERTEL to the buried dump. (see par. 20).

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Everything was dug up and appeared to be in good order. PROEBSTING took the contents of the dump with him and according to Van EEKEREN who is now at C.S.I.C. were these arms sent to FUCHS (?).

30. After having seen HOOGENDIJK again de JONG brothers returned to PROEBSTING and volunteered for line-crossing. (the idea was to gather more information for HOOGENDIJK about the existing Sonderkdo's.) PROEBSTING agreed and told us he nursed the idea that the Allies would supply Germany with arms and in the near future together with Germany would fight Russia.
31. Again de JONG brothers saw HOOGENDIJK, they talked things over and returned to PROEBSTING who told them to ~~should~~ cross the line somewhere between VREGENDAAL and WOUDENBERG. On the 2nd. (may be the 3rd.) of May subject informed HOOGENDIJK of PROEBSTING's intentions. The former promised to let the Allies know that they would arrive in the Allied lines between VREGENDAAL and WOUDENBERG on May 5th.
32. On May 4th. they went to see HOOGENDIJK again for he would give them the Watchword and the courier post, but HOOGENDIJK did not turn up.
33. XXXXKXKXKXXX PROEBSTING took them by car to the village of DE KLOOF. In the car were with PROEBSTING one driver and a Hbtstf. The Condg. Officer of the German Army in that area was Unterstf. SLOT (not the same as the a.m.) Here they were told by PROEBSTING about the Sonderkdo. STAAL being at GRONINGEN. After our return from Allied occupied country PROEBSTING would send us by ship to GRONINGEN and inform STAAL to make a contact with him by radio.
34. On May 5th. we were briefed, as subject claims, but instead of going to the right as the order were, we went straight on and ran into two Allied soldiers, which we asked for an Intelligence Officer. This happened; the I.O. was Capt. van den BERG (Dutchman). After having told him everything we knew about the German lines he took us to LUNTEREN, where we were interrogated again.
35. For more information about Sonderkdo's, we were taken to EDE, at P.F.S. where we spent the night. Next day, May 6th. we were sent to LOCHEN, where we told an I.O. all we knew about Sonder Kdo's and especially about HACKENBERG and STAAL.
36. Together with two Dutch Officers DE JONG brothers went to OEHENHOOF to spend the night. The two Officers promised them to be back on Tuesday 8th May but they never turned up.
37. At OEHENHOOF subject made acquaintance with JAN HENDRIK MEYER of Kdo. HACKENBERG who told him that the Kdo. he had belonged to was somewhere in the neighbourhood of AMELDOORN (Willie III Kazerne) Barracks. This MEYER told subject that HACKENBERG himself should be in the HAGUE.

CONCLUSION.

38. I think this is a case of security interest. Subject is a man with lack of initiative, who whenever things are not running smoothly he

SECRET.

- he looses heart and gets disappointed.
Subject has no confidence in his own capacities.
39. He was a member of the N.S.B. for three different periods of time and only resigned as he had to join the Dutch Army.
First time Conscription 1935- 1936
Second time Mobilisation 1939.
40. His anti-communistic feelings made him join the Kdo.W.H.L., but when he noticed that the Leader of this Kdo- in his opinion, was not the right man in the right place and even went on French Leave to Germany , subject got into contact with the Underground Movement. I am sure that on the very last moment subject tried everything to save his own skin.

CONCLUSION.

41. I do not think that a further interrogation is necessary and recommend his transfer to the Dutch Authorities on the ground that he is an agent and his long time membership of the N.S. B.
